

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Herstellung eines Lapbooks

Das DIN-A3-Plakat kann folgendermaßen zu einem Lapbook gefaltet werden:

Die Seiten des quer gelegten DIN-A3-Plakates werden zur Mitte gefaltet, sodass ein aufklappbares „Buch“ entsteht. Nach oben und unten kann diese Grundform bei Bedarf erweitert werden. Natürlich können Sie von vornherein sowohl eine andere DIN-Größe für das Plakat wählen als auch die Faltvorlagen der einzelnen Arbeitsblätter vergrößert oder verkleinert kopieren und so Ihrem Bedarf anpassen.

Das fertige Lapbook sowie ggf. das Deckblatt befüllen die Schülerinnen und Schüler mit den verschiedenen Gestaltungselementen zum jeweiligen Thema.

Die dabei verwendeten Kopiervorlagen können bei Bedarf von den Schülerinnen und Schülern farbig gestaltet werden. Ihnen wird so die Möglichkeit geboten, sich auf eine kreative Art und Weise mit dem aktuellen Unterrichtsthema auseinanderzusetzen und wichtige Aspekte zusammenzufassen.

Leistungsüberprüfung



Scotland has many traditions. Maybe you have heard about some of them?


- Cut out the short texts, pictures and headlines!

Have you ever seen a skirt for boys and men? In Scotland it's rather common⁶ for men to wear skirts. The skirt is part of traditional Scottish clothing. You can find them in different colours with check patterns⁷ on it – in earlier times they showed to which clan you belonged.



This day is celebrated on 30th November every year. Scottish people celebrate it with parades and get together with families and friends. They commemorate⁹ that he is the Scottish patron saint¹⁰.




Languages in Scotland
