~ Vorwort ~

Liebe Kollegen und Kolleginnen, liebe Eltern, liebe Lernende,

es freut mich sehr, dass Sie sich für dieses Heft und für die Lesespurgeschichten entschieden haben. Lesespurgeschichten sind eine tolle Möglichkeit, die **Lesekompetenz** bei Lernenden zu fördern, und gleichzeitig wecken sie auch die **Freude am Lesen**. Für Lernende der **5. und 6. Klasse** sind sie der erste Schritt weg von den traditionellen Texten im Buch hin zu ersten eigenen **Leserfahrungen** in der Fremdsprache.

Hilfestellung zum Lesen von Lesespurgeschichten:

1. Zuerst liest man die kurze Einleitung und das Textstück mit der Nummer 1.
2. Anschließend versucht man, durch den Hinweis im Text auf der Karte die nächste Nummer zu finden. Gelingt dies nicht direkt, kann man auch die nächsten Textabschnitte durchsehen und schauen, ob man Hinweise darauf findet, dass hier die Geschichte weitergehen soll.
3. Dann liest man bei der gefundenen Nummer weiter und sucht auf der Karte nach der nächsten Station. Dies wiederholt sich bis zum Schluss. (Manchmal ist es möglich, dass man im Laufe der Geschichte zweimal an denselben Ort kommt. Dies erkennt man daran, dass das entsprechende Bild zwei Nummerierungen aufweist.)
4. Findet man eine falsche Nummer, gibt der Textabschnitt einen deutlichen Hinweis, dass dies nicht die richtige Lesespur ist. Die falschen Nummern sollen nicht in die Lösungsspur „My reading trail“ eingetragen werden.
5. Nachdem die Lernenden die Lesespur komplett gelöst haben, sollten sie sie mit einem farbigen Stift in die Karte einzeichnen.

Da besonders in der 5. und 6. Klasse die Kinder mit verschiedenen Vorerfahrungen aus der Grundschule in die weiterführende Schule kommen, ist **Differenzierung** ein wichtiges Thema. Aus diesem Grund liegt jede Geschichte in **zwei Niveaustufen** vor, einem einfachen (1) und einem mittleren (2) Niveau. Das einfache Niveau kann beispielsweise auch problemlos in der Real- oder Hauptschule eingesetzt werden. Die Textabschnitte des mittleren Niveaus sind etwas ausführlicher, weisen einen anspruchsvolleren Wortschatz auf und haben zusätzlich eingebaute Rätsel, die die Lernenden lösen müssen. Beide Niveaustufen der ersten, fünften, siebten und achten Geschichte sowie die mittlere Niveaustufe der dritten und sechsten Geschichte beinhalten zudem fettgedruckte, nummerierte Buchstaben, die in der richtigen Reihenfolge ein Lösungswort ergeben. Diese hervorgehobenen Buchstaben befinden sich ausschließlich in Abschnitten der korrekten Lesespur und geben somit einen Hinweis darauf, dass der entsprechende Abschnitt definitiv Teil der Lösung ist.

Es empfiehlt sich, die erste Lesespurgeschichte mit den Lernenden gemeinsam zu bearbeiten, damit ihnen das Format danach vertraut ist. Anschließend kann man sie die nächsten Geschichten problemlos **allein** oder in **Partnerarbeit** lösen lassen. Man hat als Lehrkraft verschiedene **Möglichkeiten der Kontrolle**: Die Lernenden können sich selbstständig mithilfe der Lösungsseite kontrollieren, man bespricht die richtige Lesespur am Ende im Plenum oder die Lernenden kontrollieren sich gegenseitig mit den Sitznachbarn bzw. Sitznachbarinnen.

In der Vergangenheit hat sich herausgestellt, dass Lesespurgeschichten **verschiedene Lese- und Lerntypen** ansprechen, weil sie nicht nur Text enthalten, sondern der Text mit dem Entdecken der Spur auf der Karte kombiniert ist.

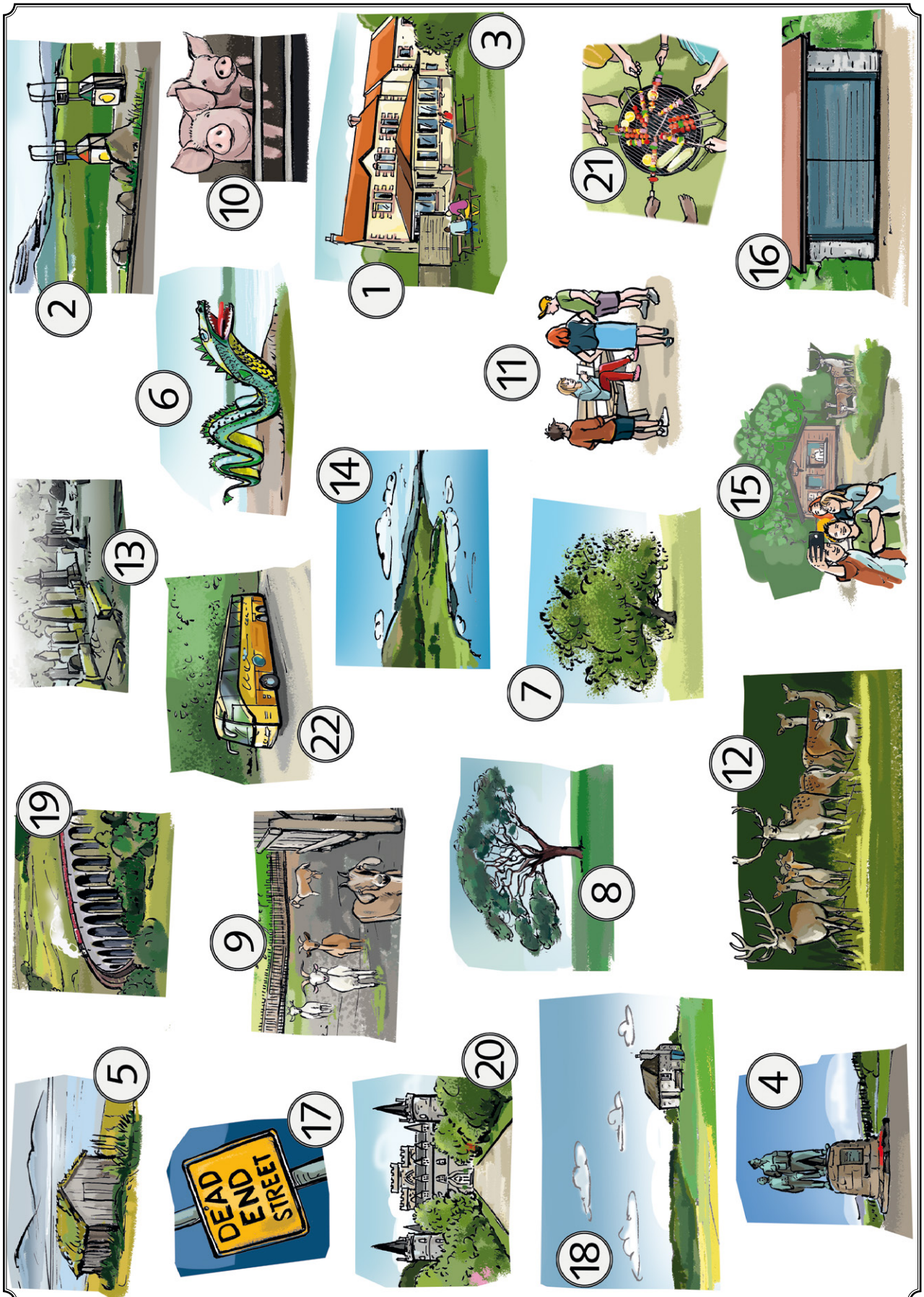

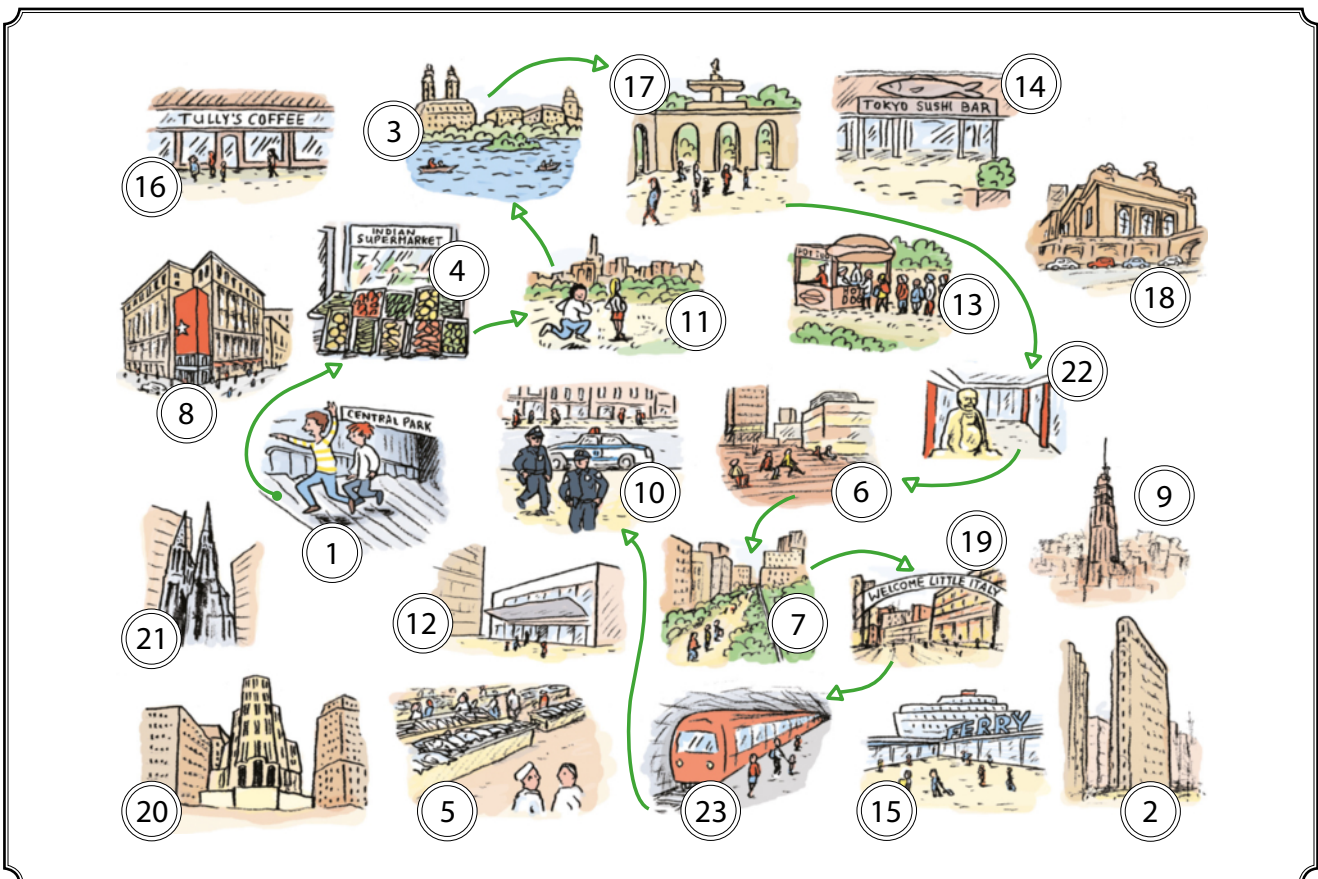

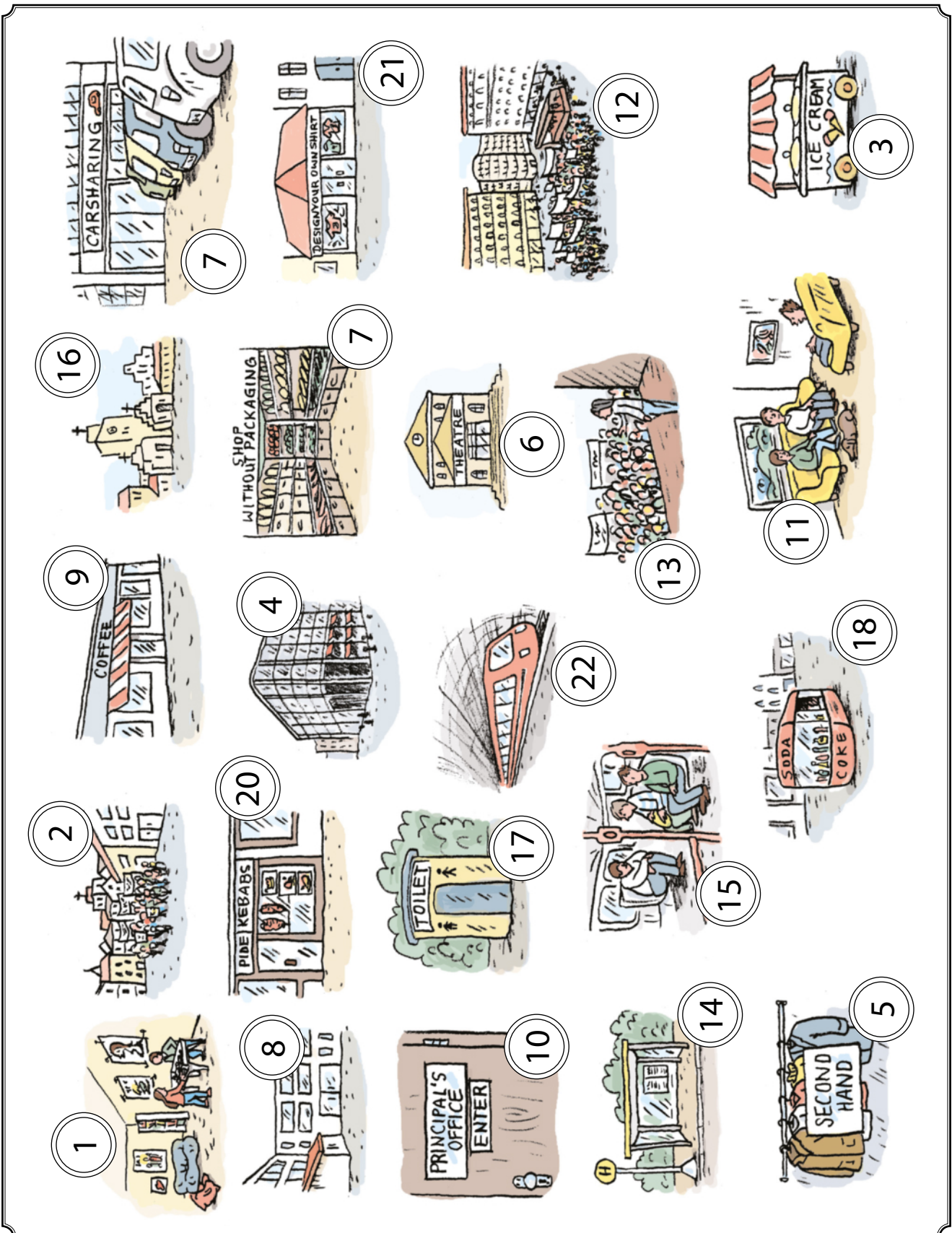

18 John agrees to what Jennifer said. He would not feel good about appearing on TV and also his parents don't know what he is doing. Over there, he buys three bottles of soda and two vanilla cokes for Jennifer and himself because he knows that Leo wouldn't like such a sweet drink. Now they are prepared to start the tour around the city. Sugar is important when it's hot, so the circulation won't collapse. He also thinks about buying something to eat but they will do so later.

19 The crowd of young people passes by a small shop selling things without packaging. This is a new trend because you avoid wasting plastic. These shops usually sell food like pasta, lentils, oats, nuts but also useful things for your daily life like soap, washing powder or cleaning equipment. Jennifer and John have already seen it when they went shopping in the city centre two weeks ago. They agree to come back soon to buy something there. Unfortunately, today they are in the middle of the crowd and don't have time to enter the shop, so please go on searching the next place.

20 Not far from school, there is a little Turkish restaurant selling food like pide or kebab where our three friends often buy lunch when they don't like the cafeteria food. Of course, crisps, chocolate and muffins are delicious, but contain too much sugar and fat which should not be consumed on a regular basis by teenagers who are still growing. John and Leo became friends with the son of the owner of the Turkish restaurant and now they come more often. Sadly, today the restaurant is closed, so they can't have lunch there.

21 Here you see the shop where you can bring a shirt and they print whatever you want on it. So Leo, Jennifer and John brought their shirts there two weeks ago (when they started planning their participation in the FFF demonstration) and showed the man behind the counter their slogans and pictures. They discussed the design of their shirts and the man promised to finish printing the shirts just in time for the demonstration. Two days later, Leo picked up the shirts and was happy with the results, also because it was not that expensive. They only paid 10 pounds per person which is an appropriate price! Today, they are well prepared and don't need to go there again, so please continue your way to the next stop.

22 Arriving at the main station, the three teenagers can see lots of people holding up posters with spicy slogans. "Make the planet GRETA again", "There is no plan(et) B" or "We need action" are just a few examples! Everybody is chatting and the atmosphere is special. Leo, in particular, has the feeling he is part of something big, a huge movement. He knows about the importance of young people uniting to set a sign against global warming. 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Solution word: The Fridays For Future demonstrations are part of the Global Youth It began in the years 2018 and 2019 and became very famous after the 2019 "Global Week for Future" which was a series of 4500 strikes across over 150 countries mainly on Friday the 20th September and Friday the 27th September.

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
